Lisa's son, Finn, is now the healthy-looking young man pictured left who has just started university. He's well stocked up with Imraldi which he injects himself every fortnight.

But it wasn't always like this for mother and son. The photo below left shows Finn aged 10 having one of his monthly infusions. Lisa told us he was very sick and



constantly off school and she couldn't imagine a time when he would be well enough to leave She home. remembers how difficult it was to have a young child so ill and feels she would have from benefitted knowing others in a similar position.



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Now Lisa wants to share a little of Finn's story with others to show them there is light at the end of the tunnel. As she says, "If anyone with a poorly child needs some reassurance, the future can be very bright indeed".

Lisa not only smashed the Run 60 Challenge by completing 60.53miles, she also raised a fantastic £665!

A huge thank you to Gwennie and to everyone who turned up and supported her








CAKE & A CUPPA AT SCARLET'S KITCHEN



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
This will save the Network valuable funds which can be used to benefit all those affected by Crohn's or Colitis.
