Car parks nearby to the Salvation Army Hall are at West Orchards and Belgrade Plaza. Both of these are accessed via junction 9 of the Ring Road. For West Orchards follow the signs for the city centre from the junction 9 roundabout, this takes you into Upper Well Street. Turn first left into Lamb Street, then first right into Chapel Street. Follow this road to its end, then turn right into Corporation Street and continue until you see the car park signposted to the left. The Belgrade Plaza car park entrance is a turn off from the slip road leading back to the ring road (counter clockwise) from the junction 9 roundabout
